

## Kara Gilman Memorial Scholarship

Awarded by the Riverside Educational Enrichment Foundation

Kara Gilman was a Riverside native and beloved teacher at John W. North High School for nearly 24 years. Not only did Kara spend the bulk of her teaching career at North, she was also an alumna (Class of 1995). Kara's son, Noah, who is set to graduate from North in the spring of 2023, continues the "blue-and-gold" tradition.

After earning a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 1998 from the University of California, Riverside, Kara continued her pursuit of higher education. In 2000, she received her master's degree in education and teaching credential from Claremont Graduate University, and in 2016, she earned a master's degree in mathematics from Kansas' Emporia State University.

In addition to Kara's work at North High School, she served as a mathematics staff development specialist for two years with Riverside Unified School District. Kara also taught evening and summer classes at Norco College for several years. When Kara wasn't working with students, she was an active member of Temple Beth El in Riverside, serving on the board, including a stint as president.

Kara served and inspired countless students over the years and was a tireless advocate for education, especially when it came to providing an equitable space for learning. To recognize her life's work, in 2023, Kara's family and friends partnered with the Riverside Educational Enrichment Foundation (REEF) to create the Kara Gilman Memorial Scholarship.

Since women are vastly outnumbered in STEM-related (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) higher education and careers, our goal for this scholarship is to champion future generations of young women and womenidentifying seniors from North High School and to help enable them to pursue careers in STEM-related fields.

In Kara's honor, scholarships of \$500 each will be awarded to select John W. North High School seniors interested in a career in a STEM-related field who complete this application.

Criteria for the Kara Gilman Memorial Scholarship:

- Student must be a graduating senior from North High School
- Student must be planning on attending a college, university, community college, or trade school
- Student must be planning on pursuing a degree/career in a STEM-related field
- GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Student must be a young woman/woman-identifying North High School senior
- One-page essay describing how the student hopes that their focus and work in their chosen STEM-related field will impact their community
- Two letters of recommendation



#### Information needed to complete the application:

- Please list all community and volunteer service from grades 9 12.
- Please include two letters of recommendation (please see recommendation forms). The letters must be from one of the applicant's teachers or counselor.
- Please list three colleges/universities/community college/trade schools that you applied to.
- Please specify how the scholarship money will be spent.
- Please write a one-page essay on the following topic and attach to this application.
   How do you hope that your focus and work in your chosen STEM-related field will impact your community
